Do we live in a world of conflict or opportunity?		Risk and Resilience
Content + skills (Intent)		
<p>Prior Learning (Topic) KS2 - human and physical geography biomes, vegetation belts, economic activity inc trade links, distribution of natural resources KS3 at Balcarras - Sustainability of Balcarras and Charlton Kings (Year 7), Human Impacts on Physical Landscapes (Year 7), Climate Change (Year 8), Antarctica (Year 8,) Population and Development (Year 8), Global Trade (Year 9), Tourism (Year 9), Clean Water (Year 9)</p>		
<p>Students will explore a range of different geographical issues in the 21st century. They will develop their knowledge and understanding of the context of each geographical issue as well as evaluating the extent of conflict in each.</p> <p>Students will first explore the reasons why conflict exists within and between countries, before focusing on conflict in Syria specifically. Students will then explore patterns of energy distribution and the concept of energy pathways. As part of this they will investigate the conflicts and opportunities in oil-rich countries, particularly within the Middle East. The third geographical issue will focus on the impacts of resource extraction in the Democratic Republic of the Congo to secure vital components in our mobile phones. The final geographical issue will focus on human rights around the world, with a particular focus on North and South Korea.</p> <p>To conclude the topic, students will use their learning to write a fact-based conclusion of the extent to which we live in a world of conflict or opportunity.</p>
