Will global trade ever be fair?		Interdependence and Inequality
Content + skills (Intent)		
<p><b>Prior Learning (Topic)</b>  <b>KS2:</b> Human geography, including: types of settlement and land use, economic activity including trade links, and the distribution of natural resources including energy, food, minerals and water</p> <p><b>KS3 Balcarras:</b> Sustainability of Balcarras and Charlton Kings (Year 7), Urban growth and industrialisation (Year 7). Development and Population (Year 8).</p> <hr/> <p>This unit contains the key themes of Trade and Globalisation. It considers economic activity in the primary, secondary, tertiary and quaternary sectors. It then considers the causes of and issues associated with the process of globalisation and its impact on global trade. The topics of containerisation, TNCs and fair and ethical trade are also explored.</p> <p>No one country is studied in depth in this topic, instead a global perspective is taken, and many countries are considered through the exploration of examples of fair trade such as Ghana and Ecuador. In addition, an in-depth study of Nike as a TNC is undertaken. Students are encouraged to consider these global issues from an individual perspective and to consider their own commitment to responsible purchasing of products. There are a series of optional tasks in this unit, including fast fashion and the sweatshop game which will complement the topic, but are not required for the assessment.
